Introduction

As societies and organizations around the world have become increasingly diverse over the last few decades, employment equity and workforce diversity have featured heavily on the political and business agenda (Klarsfeld, Combs, Susaeta and Belizón, 2012). According to a global survey conducted by the Society for Human Resource Management, USA/The Economist Intelligence Unit (SHRM, 2009: 7), 55% of respondents say their organizations have policies that promote diversity and inclusion either "strongly" or "very strongly," and another 31% promote diversity and inclusion "moderately." At the multilateral level, much attention has been paid to discrimination in the labour market, and the United Nations Global Compact initiative has incorporated a principle that seeks the elimination of employment and occupational discrimination along race, colour, sex, religion, political opinion, national extraction, social origin, age, disability, HIV/AIDS status, trade union membership, and sexual orientation lines (UN Global Compact, 2012).
