EVENTS BEYOND THE OCEAN.

THE KAISER SAYS THE CEAR AND HE ARE BOTH PROMOTERS OF PEACE.

Russia's Shores Lashed by Angry Men— Fears that Prince Ferdinand's Wife Will Not Leave—Trial of Mrs. Azevedo of Boston—The Russian Government—Is the Princess Colonna on the Way to America?

BERLIN, Feb. 7.—The members of the Reichstag who attended the Parliamentary banquet given on Monday night by Chancellor von Caprell are gradually dividing in the lobby of the Reichstag the details of the speeches made on that occasion. It is said that Emperor William intently praised the Czar, saying: "He is a prince of peace, like myself."

His Majesty is reported to have said that his relations with the Czar are excellent, and of the most intimate nature, yet should the Reichstag reject the commercial treaty annexes would immediately damage Germany.

In conversation with one of the Conservative members of the Reichstag the Emperor said that he had carefully studied the agricultural distress and anxiously contemplated remedies to relieve it. Nevertheless he was convinced that a duty on grain of 2 1/2 marks would be sufficient to protect the German farmer. Ten years ago he added, the farmers would have considered such a protective tariff beyond the range of possible relief.

The Radical newspapers express strongly their approval of the Emperor's forcible words in favor of the Russian commercial treaty. Eugen Richter's *Protestant Zeitsung* is even inclined to impugn Herr von Lottzow, President of the Reichstag, for developing views hardly in harmony with the Emperor's.

The Conservatives regard the Emperor's words as intended to exert pressure upon the Socialists, and their journals, in answering the Radical press, say that the latter would have raised the loudest outcry against this interference with the freedom of the Reichstag had they been opponents of the measure desired by the Emperor.

LONDON, Feb. 8.—The *Daily News* correspondent in Berlin says: "It is fully becoming clearer that at the bulk of the Conservatives will be unable to maintain their resistance longer. They probably will make a virtue of necessity" and make their peace with the Government."

PRINCESS COLONNA'S TROUBLE.

Who May Be in Moscow or Maybe She Has Not Yet.

PARIS, Feb. 7.—No trace has yet been found of the Princess Colonna, the stepdaughter of Mr. John W. Mackay, who leaving her husband for a judicial separation here. The Princess, who was residing in Paris, was ordered by the Court to allow her husband to see the children, but when the Prince went to the hotel at which she had been living, she had disappeared. It is reported that she has taken her departure for the United States, but both her advocate and solicitor refused to-day to either deny or confirm the report.

The solicitor of Princess Colonna will try to bring the matter before the tribunal in Paris to-morrow. The Prince has obtained a writ in a suit he has instituted in Naples demanding that the Princess return to his home on a permanent therapy, that the Prince be appointed guardian of the children. The case will come up for a hearing on Feb. 16.

There is reason to believe that the Princess was in the south of France about a week ago. The decision now is that she is either at Mentone, at which place the Court gave her permission to reside for the benefit of the health of the children, or that she has taken passage on the North German Lloyd steamer which sailed from Genoa, on last Wednesday for New York. Credit is given here to the theory that she is still at Mentone.

WASHING VALLANT'S GRAVE.

A Pamphlet Eulogizing of Him Published in Paris.

PARIS, Feb. 7.—The police are keeping a strict watch on the grave in the Cimetiere, which is supposed by some persons to contain the remains of Auguste Vallant. The police think the Anarchists may attempt to make a demonstration in the cemetery.

A pamphlet eulogizing Vallant has been secretly published here. Its authorship is attributed to a certain Feare.

VIENNA, Feb. 7.—Two Anarchist workmen and an exile named STRANAY, attached to the Czech paper *Prava Jitka*, have been arrested here on a charge of treason. It is said that the prisoners were in communication with Hamburg and Amsterdam Anarchists and that they were engaged in spreading scurrilous pamphlets.

President Cleveland to Arbitrate in Argentine-Brazil Boundary Dispute.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 7.—The formalization of the boundary controversy between Brazil and the Argentine Republic made Saturday next by President Cleveland, who is to arbitrate the disputed territory in question, known as "stone," lies at the juncture of countries with Paraguay, and has been subject of controversy for many years.
